

LECTIONARY REFLECTION

Lectionary Readings: Matthew 25: 14 -30

The Parable of the Talents



In Matthew chapters twenty-four and twenty-five Jesus continued to tell his disciples about the Kingdom of Heaven and His second coming. He used a number of parables to tell them exactly what the Kingdom of heaven was like. In this parable Jesus used many key words to drive his message home. A "man" and his "money", and his relationship with three servants. He being their "Master". Verse 18 "But the one who had received one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money".

Each had received talents according to his ability. Thus the master made each responsible for the managing of a portion of his estate. The estate belonged to the master, and the servants should serve their master to the best of their ability with the talents given to them. This fact is linked to being a steward. How do we look after the master's property. The master is looking to us to increase the value of his estate.

As believers we are given resources no matter how small to look after. We note that everyone is given at least one talent which he should use to the best of his ability. Ultimately all resources belong to God, and we will be called to give an account of how we use our talents.

We notice the fury of the master when the servant who was given one talent was called to given an account of his stewardship. His response to his master was really not good. "Master I know that you are a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed". In the end this lazy servant was order to be thrown "into outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth".

When we look at developing economies around the world many of the people depend on planting crops for a livelyhood. To gather where you did not sow, amounts to stealing from someone who has laboured to plant his field, only to find at harvest time someone has reaped his crop. There are almost always harsh punishment for people who reap where they did not sow in the world today.

Finally there is a reward which is waiting for the "good and faithful servant", for he is invited into "the joy of his Master" and praised for doing well. Likewise we who toil faithfully for the master can expect to be rewarded at the end of our days and be told "well done, my good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of my kingdom."
