Living In The Resurrection Age

Dear members and friends of TaB,

Let us pray: On this weekend, O God, we lift up our heads and shout the good news that your son Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. In these moments, may we come to know in our hearts as well as our minds that Jesus lives now and forever. May the words of our mouths, the meditations of our hearts, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord our strength and our Redeemer. Amen.

The gospels make it very clear that Jesus was always looking forward to his day of resurrection. Early in his ministry, Jesus said that the temple of his body would be raised up in three days. (John 2:19-22) Indeed, it is possible to view the teachings of Jesus as instructive in the ways that we should live in this coming age, which would be inaugurated by his resurrection from the dead.

The stone rolled away from the empty tomb on Easter Day is such a sign for us. It is indeed God's greatest miracle. We Christians are Easter people, and we are compelled by fact and moved by faith to find our greatest joy in this the greatest event and mystery in all of human history.

What the world needs now more than ever is the witness of our Easter faith. Nations, communities and individual people are seeking ways to get through the Covid-19 of their lives to the time of resurrection and new life. What people need now more than anything else is a reason to hope. They need to be able to choose life rather than death. Jesus Christ gives us that ability to choose life, as he brings hope to each and every human being.

Jesus' resurrection invites us to celebrate the gift of life even when all we seem to see around us is pain, disappointment and brokenness. It shows us that on the other side of pain, there is resurrection. It reminds us of what is possible whenever there is hope.

Think about the joy one feels upon coming home after being absent for a period of time. Consider how one is moved, staying to the end with another human being through hours of pain and dying. These are the signs, yes, the miracles of God in our everyday lives.

Hallelujah! Christ is risen, He is risen indeed! My prayer to you this glorious Easter weekend is that you take this message with you and live with it every day of your life, as Christ lives in you. May God bless you all this Easter Day.

LECTIONARY REFLECTION

Acts 10:34-43, Isaiah 25:6-9, Psalm 118:selected verses, 1 Corinthians 15:1-11, John 20:1-18 and Mark 16:1-8

Psalm 118 is a song of victory while the readings from Acts10 and Isaiah 25 are echoed in the words of StF 418, beginning:

We have a gospel to proclaim, Good news for men in all the earth; The gospel of a Saviour's name: We sing His glory, tell His worth.

As expected in this season, the other suggested scriptures focus on the resurrection of Jesus. The previous two days – especially Good Friday - must have been a particularly harrowing time for the people of God at the time. Then the Resurrection Day arrived to rekindle their hopes, aspirations and belief. The accounts in the gospels are reiterated by Paul in his first letter to the Corinthians, in which he recounts how Christ died for our sins, how he was raised on the third day, how he appeared to Cephas (Simon Peter) then to more and more of his followers and finally appeared to Paul himself, a former persecutor of the church of God!

I find that my thoughts about the resurrection are best expressed by the words of some of the ascension hymns, as in the examples below.

For her Lord now liveth, death hath lost its sting
The head that once was crowned with thorns is crowned with glory now;

Here are the words of a hymn by Fred Pratt Green, who was a Circuit minister for many years and knew what people needed to have in their hymns.

They needed confidence, honesty and joy. His Easter hymn in Singing the Faith (No314) embraces all those Easter experiences.
