Third Sunday in Lent



Dear members and friends of TaB,

We are in the season of Lent, so our thoughts and preparations are mainly how we could live and serve God. So, I bring you a verse from the gospel of Luke: "...one of Jesus's disciples asked him, 'Lord, teach us to pray". . – Luke 11:1.

We hear it said that a person's life will suffer if that person doesn't pray, but if you looked at it deeply; what will suffer is not that person's life. Instead, it brings an absence of the life of the Son of God in that person, which is nourished not by food but by prayer.

Remember when a person is born again from above, the life of the Son of God is born in that person. Prayer is the way that the life of God in us is nourished. Our common ideas regarding prayer are not found in the New Testament - as a means of getting things for ourselves, but the biblical purpose of prayer is that we may get to know God Himself.

John 16:24 - "Ask, and you will receive...". But we actually ask God for very few things. Yet a child exhibits a magnificent boldness to ask! Our Lord said, "unless you become as little children" (Matt 18:3).

Ask and God will do. Give Jesus Christ the opportunity and the room to work. The problem is that no one will ever do this until that person is at in crisis point. When a person is at a crisis point, it no longer seems to be a cowardly thing to pray. In fact, it is the only way that person can get in touch with the truth and the reality of God Himself.

In this season of Lent, be yourself before God and present Him with your problems. The very things that have brought you to your knees. As long as you think you are self-sufficient, you do not need to ask God for anything.

To say that "prayer changes things" is not as close to the truth as saying, "Prayer changes me and then I change things." God has established things so that prayer, on the basis of redemption, changes the way a person looks at things. Prayer is not a matter of changing things externally, but one of working miracles in a person's inner nature.

Amen.

## LECTIONARY REFLECTION

Lectionary Readings: Exodus 20 v 1-17, John 2 v 13-22, 1 Corinthians 1 v 18-25

### From a Market Place to a temple of God

From the Gospel of John 2 v 12- 25. Jesus got into the temple at Jerusalem for the Jewish Passover service, and he found the temple full of sales of various moneychangers. He was furious that the temple was being used for the wrong motives. The temple of God had turned into a marketplace for selling cattle, sheep, and doves. It was their tradition, of course, that they would bring items for sales to raise funds for offering, for those coming from afar would not bring cattle, doves, sheep but would find them at the church, which was easy access for the burnt offerings. To them it was normal practice ad so became the tradition. However, the coming of Christ was to give free access to God for all without any further offerings, to bring peace to the world without any further discord particularly in the meeting places of God's holy people.

God's Power through Jesus came on earth to remove the idol worshipping of burnt offerings, so looking at the access to these traditions he became very uncomfortable and the greater power in him caused him to overturn the tables and started challenging those selling in the table to stop this practice.

Looking further into the scriptures we see Moses, in Exodus 20, coming down from Mount Sanai with the commandments and one of the commandments in verse 4 says, "You shall not make yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below".

The question now comes to you and me. Are we not making the house of God the marketplace? Are we recognising that Jesus is the Power of God given unto us?

Friends do not wait for your intelligence to be made foolishness, do not wait for that disgraceful moment to catch up with you. With reference to 1 Corinthians 6 v 19, that reads "Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is within you?" We are challenged with those that sought to cause disorder in the hearts of children of God, those that stood with arrogance. It did not end in their favour other than repentance. Again in, 1 Corinthians 14 v 33 it reminds us, "...for God is not a God of disorder but of peace, as in all the meetings of God's people". Are you bringing peace to the world? I remember the song by Michael Jackson; Man In The Mirror, where he writes "If you want to make the world a better place take a look at yourself and then make a change".

As we prepare returning to the church buildings for worship, today I invite ourselves to bring the better us, the better for all, the greater joy, the greater peace.

Today friends we are called to accept the ultimate power of God, the sovereignty of God in our lives. Let the power of the holy spirit direct our footsteps as we turn away from being a marketplace to a place of worship.
