### LECTIONARY REFLECTION

# Genesis 1:1-5 & Psalm 29: 1-11



If you believe Genesis 1:1, you really have no problem believing the rest of the Bible. The God big enough to have created the heavens and the earth is big enough to do all the rest the Bible says that He did and does.

Psalm 29 may have been written by David, perhaps based on even older hymns he knew. He describes a real and powerful storm, one which spread across the Mediterranean Sea, through the mountains of Lebanon and Sirion, destroying the famous cedar forests then on down the River Jordan to the deserts of Kadesh. What a storm! Thunder, lightning, floods, even the ground shook. Such storms and earthquakes are not commonplace but do happen in that area from time to time, bringing devastation and upheaval.

This psalm begins with a call to worship, asking all heaven to give praise and recognition of His strength and glory. The poetic repeating of the phrase "The voice of the Lord..." reassures us that the power and might of God is in control of the natural world. Seven times this phrase is used to make sure we get the message! Just as in the beginning God spoke and the world came into being, God's voice is heard here. In Verse 10 the word used for flood is the same as that used for The Flood, the story of Noah, described in Genesis, it is used nowhere else in the bible. It is another reminder of God's terrible power but also of His promise of peace. Strength and peace are blessings from God we can rely on, no matter what the challenges we face.

This psalm speaks to us today as we face storms, upheaval of Lockdown and the devastation that Covid has brought to the whole world.

Be reassured and reminded that God is in control, we are blessed with peace and strength, to Him be all Glory and Honour, Amen.



*O God our heavenly Father*, as our United Kingdom has entered into more restricted lockdown, we come to you not to just seeking answers but seeking your strength and courage for the days ahead.

*God, this week we lift up* the people of TaB, the families, friends and those who have asked us to pray for them. Help them to find ways to know that you love us all and consider each one of us important and a part of your creation. Pour into our lives your Holy Spirit to take away our worries, sickness and fear.

We pray for all who are unwell, all those who are homebound or in residential care and for all those who have recently been bereaved.
