LECTIONARY REFLECTION



Mark 11: 1—11; Psalm 118: 1–2, 19 – 29; Isaiah 50: 4-9 Philippians 2: 5-11

IMAGINE; We are in Jerusalem and it is Sunday, the first day of the week, and the word is going around that Jesus will be coming to Jerusalem later today. There was never a mention of Palm Sunday. A huge crowd have gathered and are excited by the news. Many had come early to Jerusalem from throughout the entire region for the Passover. The greatest festival in the Jewish calendar. The price of everything from food to accommodation had increased. Many are now out on the street awaiting his arrival from Bethany, where he was staying with Mary, Martha and also Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead.

Suddenly there is a great commotion, with shouting and singing and there is a large crowd of followers. Inflamed with joy and jubilation they are waving palm branches, and shouting "Hosanna in the highest heaven" Mark 11:10. "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord" Ps 118:26. Such a spectacle as never before seen in Jerusalem. However, amid this fanfare Jesus arrives. Everyone wants to see or hear him.

This prophet: Jesus, with His fame of healing and teaching and the raising of Lazarus was the reason for some of them coming to Jerusalem this year. The waving of the palm branches, the spreading of garments on the roadway and his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey showed him as a king humble and peaceful. This is the first Palm Sunday. Recall how the prophet Zachariah foretold of his coming: "Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey". Zachariah 9: 9

How will we go out to meet Jesus today? Will we be shouting, waving and singing? It is Palm Sunday, just one year after we were first placed in "Lockdown" in March 2020; following the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic, we are can still proclaim Jesus King of kings, and Lord of lords. His healing power and His grace will be sufficient for us all. For on that first Palm Sunday, He alone knew that in just five more days he will be on a cross crucified in an act of ultimate sacrifice to safe us all.

On the heels of Palm Sunday, as we begin this Holy Week, may we be reminded constantly of its significance and value for our lives today. That very important day in history, when Jesus began His journey from Bethany to Jerusalem towards the cross for all humankind. Let us take these steps with Him and be jubilant to the King of kings who was sacrifice for us all. "Hosanna in the highest heaven"
